Brazil Immigration and Customs Checklist

	Passport is valid on the date you will be arriving in Brazil.
	If you aren't from a VISA exempt country: You have applied for your <u>e-VISA</u> if you are from the
	USA, Canada, or Australia. Or, you have applied for a <u>Visitor VISA</u> if you are a passport holder
	from another non VISA-exempt country.
	You have purchased travel insurance.
	You have reviewed the Brazil Immunization Recommendations .
	You have your Yellow Fever Vaccination record (if you are traveling to a https://example.com/high-risk area in Brazil).
	You have reviewed the Brazil Customs Restrictions .
	You have no narcotics and other controlled substances.

- You have no guns, explosives and ammunition.
- You haven't packed any knives or deadly weapons.
- You don't have any fresh fruit and vegetables in your luggage or carry-on.
- You haven't packed any plant or plant products.
- You haven't packed any dairy products including milk, egg and cheese.
- You don't have any fish or fish products in your luggage or carry-on.
- You aren't bringing any pets or animals to Brazil (if you are, you will need to receive authorization).
- You aren't carrying any cigarettes or alcoholic beverages of Brazilian origin.
- You aren't carrying any counterfeit money or goods.
- You haven't packed or are carrying any hazardous materials.
- You aren't carrying any pornographic material.
- ☐ You have reviewed the **Brazil Currency Restrictions**.
 - If you have more than **10,000 BR** (or **USD 1,971**), you are prepared to declare this currency when arriving in Brazil.
